Such nominations shall be in writing, signed by the members making such written nomination which shall be placed in the hands of the Secretary on or before thirty (30) days prior to the date of the election." Send Letter of Intent or Nomination by April 6, 2012 to the Association office, Attn: Secretary. Letter of Intent or Nomination may be sent via mail, fax, email or delivered in person.

Proxies for use at the Annual Meeting will only be valid if received at the Association Office via mail (USPS) or delivered in person by Tuesday, April 26, 2012. A proxy vote for your Shore Director must designate a member in good standing to cast his/her vote (only 1 vote per member per shore). Approved proxy forms may be obtained at the Association Office or mailed upon request.

**NOTE:** The By-Laws of the Association require that members' previous year's dues and assessments must be current as of January 1st, 2012 in order to participate in the Annual Meeting of members and to vote at such meeting.

**To improve the effectiveness of our Association, we urge the attendance of all members eligible to vote. Please bring your most current MEMBERSHIP card.**
